

## PUTNAM COUNTY VOTING SYSTEMS

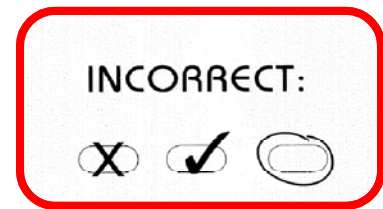
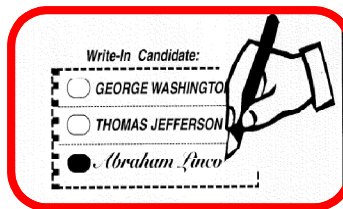
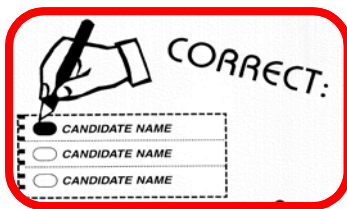
Putnam County has a "blended system" which consists of the *ACCU-VOTE OPTICAL SCAN TABULATOR* and the *DOMINION TSX TOUCH SCREEN MACHINE*.

Voters in Putnam County use the *OPTICAL SCAN TABULATOR* as their primary voting system.

Whether you vote early, at your polling place on election day or by absentee ballot request, you will be given a paper ballot and a secrecy sleeve.



Fill in the oval next to your choice, in each race.



If voting early or at your polling place, you will insert your ballot into the secrecy sleeve provided and then "feed" it into the top slot on the Optical Scan Tabulator.

The Optical Scan Tabulator will "grab" your ballot and tally the votes.

If you are voting by absentee ballot, after marking your ballot, insert it into the provided secrecy sleeve and return it to the Putnam County Supervisor of Elections office before 7:00 PM on election day.



Effective July 1, 2008, only voters with disabilities may vote on the touch screen machine.

The touch screen machine has audio capabilities. It also has the option for large text, or black and white text.

The Help America Vote Act (HAVA), requires that one touch screen machine be available in each Polling Place.
