Member Ogalla stated I did want to make a couple of statements. At the Public Health and Safety Committee meeting earlier this month, I asked several different departments to come up and give a presentation leading into our big event that's tomorrow; our HERO Helps event. So the Sheriff's department was gracious to come out and gave a nice presentation and gave us an update on the amount of training that our Sheriff's department and the other police officers in the County have been received for the use of the Narcan for heroin overdose. In addition to that they also talked about several different seizure things that they've taken where they've caught some guys who had a lot of heroin on them. Our Sheriff's department is doing a great job at finding these guys and getting these drugs off street. It's such a big problem that...it's a continuous effort that they have to keep up with. I had that so we had a nice update on that because tomorrow, April 21st, from 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. at Edward Hospital Athletic and Event Center which is at 55 Phelps Avenue in Romeoville. We are having our annual HERO Helps conference. This time we have a summit on heroin opioid epidemic in Illinois and we'll be hearing from panelists from Will County, Dupage County, Cook and Lake to tell us how they are handling the heroin problem in all these different counties. So hopefully everyone can all work together and find out what works for here and what works there and we can improve what we're doing so that more and more lives are saved from this epidemic. I just wanted to make sure everyone was aware of that and hopefully those of you who can attend will be there tomorrow

morning because it's a very important event and very informal. I just want to make that note and that's what I have for you today.

That was on the news this morning in Chicago, Member Ogalla, and I thought that was very timely for us to know that and (inaudible). I also want to welcome Member Militello. Member Militello has a lot of experience in government, not only in serving and working in different government bodies, but being an elected official herself. I think that brings a lot of experience and we'll do a good job in helping Member Gould serve the folks in District Six. I want to also thank my Republican caucus. You all have done a lot of work over this last couple of months here and really appreciate the hard work that not only the Republican caucus but also the Democratic caucus over here. You guys know we can't get this stuff done without people coming together, working together, we can see that in Springfield. When they're not together, nothing gets done. So at least we can say that we can

actually pull it off and get some stuff done, leading to my final comment: I have a prediction...if the Blackhawks win tonight, they go all the way.

<u>Announcements by County Board Minority Leader, Herbert Brooks, Jr.</u>

Member Brooks stated good morning Executive Walsh, good morning ladies and gentlemen. It's still morning too, that's a good thing to say. Let me, first of all, begin by just a reminder tomorrow morning and the HERO program in Romeoville tomorrow morning, I did hear Ms. Anastasia Tuskey on the radio this morning. Who were you on the radio with?

Ms. Anastasia Tuskey stated Dr. Burke.

Member Brooks stated Dr. Burke. I couldn't quite tell by the voice, I just heard a little of it. Glad to hear them talk about that. That's in Romeoville tomorrow morning at 7:30 a.m. Get there early for the donuts, I would encourage it. I also want to congratulate Member Militello for willing to serve here on our Will County Board. Often times I tell people in our church world, "Be careful for what you ask for," but we thank God that they come forward to say, "Here I am, send me." So congratulations on your swearing in today, Member Militello, and we look forward to working with you. Lastly, as we begin this summer coming up, often times I want to remind people to not only be careful since we come back in May and Mother's Day will have been passed, Happy Mother's Day to all of our mothers. If I don't say that on the camera, I've got one that would remind me, so to all of our mothers and all of you, thank you so much and God bless you all.

Announcements by County Board Speaker, James Moustis

Member Moustis stated thank you Executive Walsh. First let me say, Blackhawks don't give up. I'm going to talk about not giving up. Have faith...you should always have faith. One of the reasons I think this County, unlike many...the state government, some local governments, we've really worked hard. We've never given up. We've never looked at a situation and said it's impossible and let's give up. We find ways to make government work here for the people. I can't tell you how proud I am of this County Board, past County Boards, elected officials, Countywide elected officials (inaudible) because we did work together in a nonpartisan way. Everybody has to give a little. Because of that, and I can't forget staff by the way, we have the greatest staffs, our elected officials do. We have the greatest employees that make this happen. With all of the negative news in government, and of course, the state government dominates the news, and all the negative...they can't get a budget, you have a legislature that wants to spend more money then perhaps there's revenue and then you have a Governor who wants to include other things in the budget...I don't know. I'm glad I'm not there actually. Or maybe we should all be there, right? Maybe we could help. But Will County has lived within its means, it has reserves, it has capital projects that it's been able to bring forward that will benefit the public, and doing all this while keeping the tax rates stable, in other words, not increasing them. I don't think we've increased them for some time, actually. And I mean some time like, over

years. So I just want to say that we don't toot our horn but maybe, like your children, when your kids do something good, you want to shout out I'm proud and I'm proud of you all for the hard work and dedication and cooperation. The nonpartisanship I believe is very often a word that's thrown out there, but I do think that in a nonpartisan way, almost all the important issues, doesn't mean that we can't have differences in opinion. So I just want to thank everyone and have faith...don't give up. Don't give up on our Hawks, don't give up on our state government, don't give up. We'll get through this. And the Bulls are going to upset Boston (inaudible), so hopefully. Thank you everyone. I didn't realize we wouldn't be back until after Mother's Day, so Happy Mother's Day everyone. My mother is passed, but our mothers are always with us. Thanks everyone very much.

Executive Walsh stated thank you Member Moustis. Being there's no Executive Session, I want to inform people that Mr. Dave Tkac has informed me that on May 3rd, right here in this room there's going to be a contractors outreach, May 3rd at 3:30 p.m. which contractors will be here and the discussion will be on the Will County proposed Courthouse. A lot of questions, a lot of interest coming down (inaudible).

Member Weigel stated you skipped an item, County Board Comments.

Executive Walsh stated oh, okay.

Member Weigel stated I'd like to make a comment concerning the proposal for leaf burning. Several residents in my district and other districts have complained about smoke generated from burning leaves over the past several years. The Mayor of Mokena has expressed a need to prohibit leaf burning as it blows onto residential properties in the Village. In District 12, residents of Mokena and New Lenox have complained to me about smoke blowing onto their properties and causing them distress. In unincorporated areas of the County, the only significant restriction of leaf burning is that it must be at least 50 feet from a neighbor's home or accessory structure. The 50 foot limit is somewhat meaningless since smoke from leaves can travel several hundred feet. Most people who complain about smoke coming onto their property have respiratory problems which are aggravated by breathing smoke filled air. Residents with respiratory problems must stay indoors seven days a week during the fall season when leaf burning is prevalent. A possible solution for residents with respiratory problems would be to prohibit leaf burning altogether as most municipalities do. An alternative solution would be to limit leaf burning to two days per week on Wednesday and Saturday. This would give relief to individuals on the other five days a week as they would not have to stay indoors. If it should happen it's too windy on a particular Wednesday or Saturday, the resident could wait until the next week when conditions are more favorable. Residents are accustom to having their garbage picked up one day per week now. Restricting leaf burning to two days per week would be similar and they would soon adapt to the restriction. I would like the

County to pursue a change in our current ordinance to restrict leaf burning to two days per week. This proposed change would not impact farmers or the Forest Preserve as they are exempt from the ordinance. Residents who have fire pits to burn wood for social gatherings are also exempt. I would appreciate any Board members input concerning this proposal and I'd like to bring it forward in the future. Thank you.

Member Summers stated yes I was going to say something before Member Hart recognized that and I just want to go back to the Public Health and Safety HERO summit. I have to say it was one of the best Public Health and Safety meetings I have ever attended. A lot of good information came out and I hope that the folks in our County do take this very seriously and I hope we see a lot of our County Board members there supporting...Dr. Kathleen Burke, Ms. Susan Olenek, our Sheriff's Department is very involved in this as well as our State's Attorney's office. Kudos to them and again, this is an important thing. A healthy County is a prosperous County. Thank you.
