Executive Walsh stated Mr. Pete McLenighan I apologize, come on down. The vote has already been taken but we'll listen to you any time. I apologize I didn't see that before.

Mr. Pete McLenighan stated thank you so much. I'm the Executive Director of Stepping Stones here in Joliet. We serve primarily Will County. I appreciate the prior comments about really being practical and really understanding what you're voting for in support of this resolution. I love the resolution. It reads wonderfully. It's a little sketchy on the funding if there's any real mention of it all. You know better than I that you went through a difficult process here recently about serious and severe reductions and essential services at the Will County Health Department for these same types of services. Stepping Stones, about 45% of the people that we treat have co-occuring disorders, not only substance abuse disorder but a mental health disorder. Again, the County has been very aggressive on this. The drug court, the mental health court, and the criminal justice system and to the health care system...you have a wonderful track record. What you may not know also is that you have a wonderful resource in the mobilizing action through planning and partnerships. This is the County's health plan. Every three years counties are responsible to do a health plan. Every planning cycle in recent decades has identified behavioral health services as being nowhere close to meeting the demand or need. So what occurred in the last planning cycle was that there was an action team established to address this specifically and that action team developed a survey that was submitted about a year ago and then repeated most recently here. Some of the results of that are there's 65% of the respondents reported a wait for services, some as long as months that they

identified the barriers to expansion. This is a document, again, that's available to you and a great resource. Psychiatric services, the number one identified gap in services. The primary population that's lacking in ability to access services are the uninsured. About 70% of the respondents refer people routinely to hospital emergency departments; so really, again, really inappropriate and inefficient and costly option and resource that's routinely used. And, of course, we know that the jails are not the place that we want people getting mental health services too; so again you do have another resource available to you that's the local area network. That's a network of health and behavioral health service providers that focus specifically on this. So again, a wonderful resolution, but again, we need to go into it with eyes wide open. I personally don't see any way that this is going to be meaningful without not only additional funding, but in all likelihood additional revenue, so thank you very much. (Inaudible).

Member Ogalla stated I just wanted to give a little information about the Public Health Report from the Will County Health Department Community Health Center that we all received in our mailboxes and I did want to provide a little bit of information from the letter from the Executive Director for everyone. It gives a good little summary of what the County Board of Health does and their mission. This is from our Executive Director, Ms. Sue Olenek. On behalf of the Will County Board of Health and more than 300 agency employees, we are pleased to present Will County Health Department Annual Report for 2015. The public health landscape has changed significantly since the Health Department's first annual report was issued in 1946. New public health challenges have emerged over the decades, but the 69th annual report clarify documents. A mission which has remained essentially unchanged through the years. Our public health mission continues to focus on prevention, promotion and protection. As you review the contents of this document, please be assured that what we do reflects our commitment to these essential core functions. Much of what we accomplished in 2015 was made possible by the long-term leadership provided by two men who worked tirelessly on behalf of this agency and all of Will County. Veteran Board Health President John J. Heinz, Jr. And former Executive Director John J. Cicero has since retired. The work set high standards for those who have replaced them. Last spring the agency moved to enhance services to the more than 115,000 residents in eastern Will County with the opening of a new office at 5601 West Monee-Manhattan road in Monee. The 4,000 square foot facility replaced an older site in University Park. As always, this agency wishes to thank the Will County Board of Health, Will County Board, the Will County Executive and the citizens of Will County for their support. Ongoing support will enable us to continue with the accomplishment of our public health mission. I think it's important that everyone recognizes that we are committed to helping our Board of Health provide the services that are essential, and that I had spoken with the Executive Director and she is going to be moving forward with reviewing everything for next year to make sure that everything that is a core mission is properly funded. I just want to let everyone have that bit of information.

One thing...we ran out of time and we could have had this conversation with them for two hours straight...we also had our consultants down at lobbyist Hassert and Curry as well giving us some reports. I do want to bring up something and I think everyone received this email from (inaudible) yesterday. It was about the Senate Bill 2701, the IMRF. The whole thing with that, the documenting the 600 hours and of going the 90 days after election...the whole methodology of it I agree with, I've always been. It's no secret I never did take the pension here, the IMRF. I do not pay into that, I do not submit. So what my problem was with this Bill as it's passed both houses and the Governor's going to sign, it doesn't go far enough. Looking at this, and it took me, I kept reading it and it had municipalities when it first came out with Senator (inaudible). Well now municipalities was taken off and they're not being accountable themselves. They're part-time, they're going in, and they're always cancelling session, so all it really leads on to is County Board members, the County in general. So I just have a little problem with that and I would like to see, for all sake listening, or possibly to go back and have it added where all elected officials. If we're going to do it, I'm not really sure, well, I do know who sponsored in the House going for a different office on to the County so, once again, political at its finest.

Member Moustis stated maybe Mr. Nick Palmer would like to say a few things (inaudible) public record so people have an understanding of what the program is.

Mr. Nick Palmer stated good morning. This is a formula grant that we get every year. There's a complex formula how we get the funds but it's a partnership with the city of Joliet and the County, we jointly apply. The County has handled the application process the last seven years; this was heard at both the Judicial Committee and the Executive Committee. Just a quick summary of what we've spent the past few years. In 2013 we spent it on a heroin education program in the Valley View schools in Bolingbrook and Romeoville. In 2014 we used these funds to launch our (inaudible) Program where we had some trained professionals train all of our law enforcement folks. In 2015 we used it for Planfield school districts which they're launching this fall and then this year we're recommending to the Board for action to fund continuing education program in both the Lincoln-Way high schools and then the Wilmington junior high and high schools. These funds are the primary funding source from the federal government for these types of law enforcement, and you can use it for other things...equipment and what have you...but we're using it for the heroin problem. Part of our comprehensive approach to both education in the schools but also response with the first responders. This is a \$56,296 total grant between the County and the city. We've negotiated over the past 10 years to continue to split this 50/50, so you'll be voting on an MOU that does that formally splits it 50/50 and then you'll also be approving the recommendation to spend it on these heroin education programs. The application is posted on the Will County website. It will be there for at least 30 days. So if there are any further public comments we can accept those and, after those 30 days, sometime after the DOJ will approve the application and we'll get the money and we can move forward. I can take any questions.

Executive Walsh stated any questions?

Member Brooks stated Mr. Nick Palmer the \$56,000 would be split between us and Joliet?

Mr. Nick Palmer stated yes.

Member Brooks stated you mentioned some schools. Will the Joliet portion be participating in the heroin program or the schools you mentioned will they be doing their own thing?

WHEREAS, Father Lescher continues to participate in marches for the rights of undocumented workers, against profit prisons and welcomes Narcotics Anonymous, Alcoholics Anonymous and Sexual Abuse Groups into the Parish, and

WHEREAS, on June 19, 2016 Father Raymond Lescher will retire after 18 years as Pastor of Sacred Heart Church.

# Stepping Up Initiative to Reduce the Number of People with Mental Illnesses in Jails

WHEREAS, counties routinely provide treatment services to the estimated 2 million people with serious mental illnesses booked into jails each year; and

WHEREAS, prevalence rates of serious mental illnesses in jails are three to six times higher than for the general population; and

WHEREAS, almost three-quarters of adults with serious mental illnesses in jails have cooccurring substance use disorders; and

WHEREAS, adults with mental illnesses tend to stay longer in jail and upon release are at a higher risk of recidivism than people without these disorders; and

WHEREAS, county jails spend two to three times more on adults with mental illnesses that require interventions compared to those without these treatment needs; and

WHEREAS, without the appropriate treatment and services, people with mental illnesses continue to cycle through the criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic outcomes for these individuals and their families; and

WHEREAS, Will County and all counties take pride in their responsibility to protect and enhance the health, welfare and safety of its residents in efficient and cost-effective ways; and

WHEREAS, Will County has found success by creating Drug and Mental Health Court programs which helps people stay out of jail by offering mental health and substance use disorder treatment; and

WHEREAS, through *Stepping Up*, the National Association of Counties, the Council of State Governments Justice Center and the American Psychiatric Association Foundation are encouraging public, private and nonprofit partners to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in jails.

  adults entering jails with mental illnesses and their recidivism risk, and use that baseline
  information to guide decision making at the system, program, and case levels.
- Examine treatment and service capacity to determine which programs and services are available in the county for people with mental illnesses and co-occurring substance use disorders, and identify state and local policy and funding barriers to minimizing contact with the justice system and providing treatment and supports in the community.
- Develop a plan with measurable outcomes that draws on the jail assessment and prevalence data and the examination of available treatment and service capacity, while considering identified barriers.
- · Implement research-based approaches that advance the plan.
- Create a process to track progress using data and information systems, and to report on successes.

## ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY BOARD WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS

#### Ascertaining 2016 Prevailing Wage Rates

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.), and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the County Board of Will County investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of Will County employed in performing construction of public works for said County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF WILL COUNTY:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the County of Will is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing wages for construction work in the Will County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June of the current year a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the County of Will. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 3: The Will County Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by an interested party in the main office of the County of Will this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

<u>SECTION 4:</u> The Will County Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Will County Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance

#### **Purpose**

The purpose of the fire protection district is to engage in the acquisition, establishment, maintenance and operations of fire stations, facilities, vehicles, apparatus and equipment for the prevention, control of fire, and the underwater recovery of drowning victims, provide as nearly adequate protection from fire for lives and property within the districts as possible and regulate the prevention and control of fire therein.

#### Board information: (70 ILCS 705/4)

Sec. 4.01 Five member boards.

(a) Any appointed board of trustees of a fire protection district may provide for the establishment of a 5-member board of trustees by adopting an ordinance to that effect. An appointed board of trustees shall also be increased to a 5-member board upon the adoption of a proposition to increase the board as provided in subsection (b) of this Section. When such an ordinance or proposition has been adopted, the appropriate appointing authority shall, within 60 days of the date of the adoption of the ordinance or proposition, appoint 2 additional trustees to the board of trustees, one to hold office for 2 years and one to hold office for 3 years from the first Monday of May next after their appointment and until their successors are appointed and have qualified. The lengths of the terms of these 2 additional members shall be determined by lot at the first meeting of the board of trustees held after the 2 additional members take office. The 3 trustees already holding office in the district shall continue to hold office for the remainder of their respective terms. Thereafter, on or before the second Monday in April of each year the appropriate appointing authority shall appoint one trustee or 2 trustees, as shall be necessary to maintain a 5-member board of trustees, whose terms shall be for 3 years commencing the first Monday in May of the year in which they are respectively appointed.

Under Section one (1)....The committee shall consist of twenty-six (26) voting members as provided by statute and as specified in the Resolution 13-263, enacted by the Will County Board on October 17, 2013, establishing the Committee, and as indicated below:

- A) County members: Thirteen (13) members shall be appointed by the County Executive from the appropriate County Board districts.
- B) Municipal members: Thirteen (13) members shall be representatives of Will County municipalities, one from each County Board districts. They shall be appointed by a majority vote of the mayors of those municipalities which have the greatest percentage of their respective populations residing in each of the said thirteen County Board districts.
- C) Alternates: One alternate member per County Board district may be designated by each appointing authority as defined in Article III Section 1.
- D) Advisory Members: Advisory members may be appointed through a subsequent resolution by the majority vote of the twenty-six (26) Committee members.
